

Lesson 22.1 Jesus feeds the five thousand

Based on *Friends and Heroes DVD Episode 22: The Big Lift*

Bible story: *Jesus feeds the five thousand (Mark 6:30-44)*



Learning objectives

- For pupils to be able to retell the story of Jesus feeding five thousand people
- For pupils to reflect on their own behaviour
- For pupils to enjoy eating and sharing together

Display – Create a display in your classroom of the story characters, along with objects, books, puppets, pictures and the key questions connected with the Bible story focused on in this lesson.

- A table cloth
- A picnic basket
- Five loaves and two fish (plastic or pictures)
- Story books about the feeding of the five thousand
- A picture of the fields around Lake Galilee

Lesson outline

Watch first part of Episode 22.

Key questions and Worksheet 22.1a.

Discussion about behaviour followed by Worksheet 22.1b.

Class picnic.

1st

First step

In the Friends and Heroes adventure story the people in Jerusalem are very hungry, they are starving. This episode focuses on how God provides in times of need, especially if we all work together to help one another.

While standing in Toadie's stolen store of grain, Lucius and Macky remember the story of when Jesus fed five thousand people with only five loaves and two fish.

Before watching the film clip, briefly discuss how it feels to be hungry and then to have food. Talk about picnics, enjoying food outdoors and eating with other people – family, friends etc.

Watch Episode 22 until 10.58 just after Macky has shared his ideas with Isaac, Devorah and Abe.

Key questions – Use these questions to encourage pupils to connect their own experiences with the events and characters in the programme. Include the key questions on your display.

Why did all those people want to listen to Jesus?

What do you think the people learnt from Jesus?

How do you think the disciples felt when all they could find was five loaves and two fish?

How do you think the disciples felt when sharing the food?

How did the people feel about being a part of this giant picnic?

I wonder what happened to the leftovers?

Would you have liked to have been there? Why?

I wonder what you thought was the most important part of the story?



Story focus and Activity

Bible reference: Mark 6:30-44
Jesus feeds the five thousand

The children may already be familiar with this story. However, recap the events of the feeding of the five thousand using storybooks from your display to help you. Use the key questions to explore the story further. Follow this with Worksheet 22.1a.

In the story Jesus tells the people that they must be kind and help everyone, even the Romans. "Treat everybody as you would like them to treat you." What did Jesus mean by this?

Think about the Friends and Heroes story. Who helps who? Macky is trying to help the people in Jerusalem.

Lucius and Portia are helping Macky.
Tobias is not helping anyone but himself!
Who is behaving in the way that Jesus is talking about?

Now give the children Worksheet 22.1b, challenging them to think about their own behaviour. Encourage the children to consider what this means for them.
How would they like to be treated?
How should they treat others?

To conclude...

Have a class picnic, enjoy sitting outside together sharing a small snack. Emphasise that you are all sharing food and time together. Everyone can help tidy up. What will you do with any leftovers?



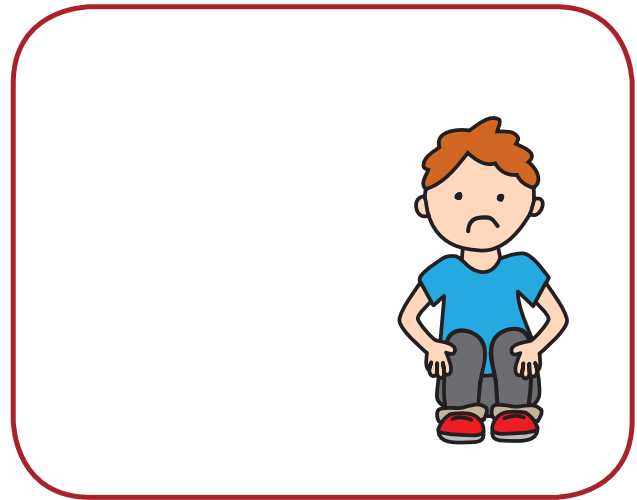
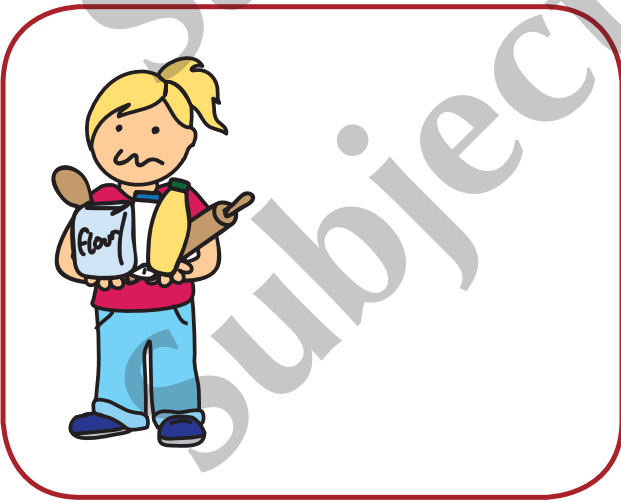
